We are launching an Appeal for £50,000 which will enable us to provide reliable sources of clean water at the village clinics of Semembele, Nyasa, Mwasala and Ibambo.

Our History

FUM was set up in 1964 following the UN Freedom from Hunger Campaign, when enduring links were established with the districts of Urambo, Nzega and Sikonge in the Tabora Region of Tanzania. FUM has concentrated on supporting Rural Training Colleges, Schools and Village Clinics in these districts.

Our Aim

Our aim has been to ensure that all our sponsored institutions have fully equipped buildings with a safe, reliable, water supply and so FUM has provided water harvesting tanks or wells at the schools and clinics we support.

Our Challenge

Many villages no longer have access to an adequate water supply during the dry season because changing patterns of climate mean that previously satisfactory wells now run dry. Instead, these villagers have to seek water from open ground sources, water generally of very poor quality.

Our Appeal

FUM has provided deep boreholes for Nzega and Urambo District hospitals and several villages. The success achieved makes us determined to sink boreholes at each of our twelve village clinics, providing clean water for the clinic and the whole village. Each borehole and ancillary work costs around £12,000, so we are launching this appeal to raise sufficient funds to equip the four villages in greatest need.
